The fact that 43 states had appropriated \$6,819,668 by July 15, 1972, plus the fact that there are strong indications that the 50-state total will reach about \$8.4 billion-- a gain of 20 per cent over the \$7 billion of two years earlier, gives cause for continued confidence in American state legislatures, despite all their eccentricities. Only a few have stumbled rather badly, and apparently none has come to a halt at the present level of state tax support for higher education.

There are signs that the current temporary slowdown in rates of gain may soon turn upward, and state support, as well as support from federal and other sources, may become commensurate with increasing enrollments and augmented responsibilities of state universities, colleges, and junior colleges.
