TEXAS. Southwest Texas State University at San Marcos has been authorized by the Coordinating Board of Texas Universities and Colleges to purchase the campus and buildings of San Marcos Academy, at total cost not to exceed \$11½ million. The 18 buildings are on 83 acres of land adjacent to the university campus.

The university plans that the additional land will be used for new housing and parking facilities, and space for several departments now located in the central area of the campus.
