New Jersey joins the Billion Dollar Club: For fiscal year 1987-88, New Jersey appropriated \$1,013,000 of state tax funds for operating expenses of higher education -- a 20 percent gain over FY1985-86. Each of ten states now appropriates over a billion dollars for a total of approximately \$18.4 billion: California (4.75 billion), Florida (1.36), Illinois (1.33), Michigan (1.30), New York (2.94), North Carolina (1.08, last year), Ohio (1.26), Pennsylvania (1.18), Texas (2.23) and New Jersey (1.01).
