Included also are a map of two-year percentage gains, a table of FY1989-90 appropriations per capita and per \$1,000 of personal income for each of the states, and a 50-state summary table of appropriations and percentage gains over two and ten year. These are followed by a tabulation for each of the fifty states, showing the appropriations for fiscal years 1988-89 and 1989-90, as it appeared in Grapevine, with data revision submitted by November 1, 1989.
