Revisions to FY1990-91

The symbol (R) following the year 1990-91 in column 2 of the tabulation for each state indicates there has been a revision to data previously reported for that fiscal year. Increasingly, the states are updating the information which has appeared in **Grapevine**. For the 23 states reported thus far this year, only five indicated no change in last year's data. Thirteen of the states indicated decreases which ranged from less than one percent (0.9%) to 10%. Five states indicated increases, ranging from 0.3% to 4.9%
